Deaf Interpreter Training: An Introduction With Nigel Howard and Julie Simon

This 26-hour, introductory-level workshop is geared toward Deaf people who are interested in becoming interpreters. The workshop will include both theoretical and practical applications and will focus on three main components:

Understanding the Role and Responsibilities of Deaf Interpreters

- ❖ How does the Deaf community view Deaf Interpreters
- ❖ Recognizing the difference between an interpreter's role and an advocate's role
- ❖ Where and how Deaf interpreters work.
- ❖ How Deaf interpreters can effectively and successfully serve in various settings -- ranging from classroom to conference hall to courtroom.
- ❖ Boundaries when working as an interpreter
- ❖ How to do assignment assessment and preparation
- ❖ When and how to work with other interpreters (deaf/hearing),
- ❖ Current business practices and standards in the field

Ethics and Decision Making for Deaf Interpreters

- ❖ Issues relating to interpreting in community settings, including personal, societal, cultural and professional ethics
- ❖ Issues when working with school personnel
- ❖ Issues when working as part of a team
- ❖ Situational assessment.
- ❖ How to make linguistic and cultural adjustments
- ❖ Decision-making processes and the impact on interpreting

Understanding the Process of Interpreting for Deaf Interpreters

- ❖ How information is processed during an interpreting assignment.
- ❖ Consecutive and simultaneous interpreting processes
- ❖ Text and situational analysis.
- ❖ Different models of interpreting to understand how the message gets from the speaker to the audience
- ❖ How to make linguistic and cultural adjustments

Workshop is limited to 18 people. Participants are expected to attend the entire workshop.

This workshop will be presented in ASL. Interpreters will not be provided.

Nigel Howard is an ASL Instructor at Douglas College in the Department of Sign Language Interpretation, and also works as Instructor for the Child, Family and Community Studies. He is the ASL coordinator for Continuing Education Department. Nigel has worked as a Deaf Interpreter for 15 years, often in medical, mental health, legal and conference (local, national and international) settings. He has BA in Psychology from the University of British Columbia and has taken course work toward a Master's degree. Nigel is a member of West Coast Association of Visual Language Interpreters and Association of Visual Language Interpreters of Canada.

Julie Simon has been an American Sign Language/English Interpreter for over 27 years and an interpreter educator for over 20 years, having taught in both pre-service and in-service settings on a wide range of topics, and holds RID certification (CI & CT). Prior to opening *The Language Door* in March 2007, she served for over 11 years as Administrator for the Western Region (formerly Region X) Interpreter Education Center at Western Oregon University. Julie received her doctorate from the University of Arizona in Language, Reading and Culture, and her masters from Boston University in Deaf Education/ASL Studies.
